The project includes creating a new bridge design that will last 100-years and transforming South Capitol Street into a prominent gateway. The presentation will focus on the project's technical complexities including the design and construction of an innovative three-arch system that allows the superstructure to freely move through the arches. The presentation will also highlight the procurement process for this \$453 million design-build project including the unique Visual Quality goals and the ranking criteria that drove creativity and ingenuity.

Breakout #11 Multijurisdictional Coordination for Safe Streets and Roads for All Applications (SS4A) | Old Louisville

This presentation will discuss Kentucky's unique approach in developing multijurisdictional groups for Safety Action Plan Grants through the USDOT Safe Streets and Roads for All funding program. The direct local funding process of SS4A created challenges for smaller rural communities to apply for funds due 1) awareness of funding opportunities and 2) familiarity with federal grant management. The Kentucky Local Technical Assistance Program (LTAP) worked with Area Development Districts to disseminate information and form multijurisdictional groups for applications. (continued)



This approach allowed for a high level of information sharing between local agencies to ensure that federal and grant specific

requirements were met. Additionally, building off of the existing Local Road Safety Plan processes established in partnership with the KYTC Highway Safety Improvement Program. This approach allowed Kentucky to submit 12 action plan grant applications, covering 90 of 120 counties in the state.
